ANTIBIOTIC PROTOCOL FOR JOINT REPLACEMENT PATIENTS

DENTAL PROCEDURES:

It is no longer necessary to take an antibiotic for <u>dental cleanings</u> provided you have good oral hygiene, visit your dentist regularly and are not in a high risk group (see below). It is recommended to avoid any dental procedures 1 month before until 3 months after joint replacement.

High Risk Patients:

- Immunosuppressed or immunocompromised:
 - Rheumatoid arthritis
 - o Systemic Lupus Erythematosus
 - o Crohn's disease
 - Radiation or drug induced immunosuppression (autoimmune disorders, chemotherapy, HIV, etc.)
- High risk comorbidities
 - o Insulin dependent (Type 1) Diabetes
 - Ongoing Cancer / Malignancy
 - o HIV Infection

Antibiotics are necessary for major dental procedures such as dental extractions, root canals or any procedure where significant bleeding might be expected.

- Amoxicillin, Cephalexin or Cephradine 2g orally one hour prior to procedure
- If Penicillin allergic: Clindamycin 600mg orally one hour prior to procedure

OPTHALMIC PROCEDURES:

Many options: Gentamycin, Tobramycin, Ciprofloxacin, Gatifloxacin, Levofloxacin, Moxifloxacin, Ofloxacin or Meomycin-Gramicidin-Polymyxin B multiple drops subconjunctivally. Consult Ophthalmologist or Pharmacist for dosing regimen.

ORTHOPAEDIC PROCEDURES:

Cefazolin 2g IV, Cefuroxime 1.5g, Clindamycin 600mg IV or Vancomycin 1g IV. Begin infusion 60 mins prior to procedure. Full dose must be given prior to tournique inflation.

VASCULAR PROCEDURES:

Cefazolin 1-2g IV or Vancomycin 1g IV 60 mins prior to procedure.

HEAD & NECK PROCEDURES:

Clindamycin + Genta 600-900mg IV or Cefazolin 1-2g IV 60 mins prior to procedure.

OBSTETRIC & GYNECOLOGICAL PROCEDURES:

Cefazolin 1-2g IV, Ampicillin/sulfabactam 3g IV 60 mins prior to procedure.

GENITO-URINARY PROCEDURES:

Ciprofloxacin 500mg PO or 400mg IV 60 mins prior to procedure.

GASTRO-INTESTINAL PROCEDURES: (Includes Gastroscopy and Colonoscopy)

Upper GI tract: Cefazolin 1-2g IV 60 mins prior to procedure.

Colorectal: Metronidazole 1g (oral) or Metronidazole 500mg IV + Cipro 400mg IV 60 mins prior to procedure. Consult with GI physician and/or pharmacist.

*** <u>All Bacterial Infections</u> should be treated immediately with antibiotics to prevent risk of spread to your joint replacement. If you are uncertain if you need antibiotics please call my office for further directions.
